

## DR-TB STAT: Summary and Updates

September, 2016

### Overall:

- Current number of patients on BDQ under program conditions: **5234 total**
  - 3145 South Africa; 233 Belarus; 191 Georgia; 93 Armenia, 68 Swaziland, 1008 Russia, 39 Indonesia, 12 PNG; 33 Lesotho; 53 Peru; 132 Kazakhstan; 6 Kenya, 62 Viet Nam; 12 Philippines; 12 Latvia; 15 Estonia; 20 Haiti; 28 India (10 RNTCP, 18 MSF) ); Ethiopia 4; North Korea 17; Pakistan 19 (IRD); Bangladesh 32 (IRD)
  - Total number CU= **766**.
  - Current number of BDQ orders from GDF: **4528**
- Current number of patients on DLM under program conditions and CU: **180** according to company
  - 11 from MSF in Belarus; 13 from MSF in Armenia; 33 from MSF in Georgia; 35 from MSF in South Africa/Khayelitsha; 10 Latvia; 10 Estonia; 15 Kazakhstan PIH (and 70 course just cleared customs); 42 India from MSF; 16 Lesotho PIH; Ethiopia 1 PIH; = **366 total**
  - Current number of DLM orders from GDF: **1018**

### Country Updates:

- South Africa: continues to progress well and accounts for 60% of BDQ use globally
- China: No formal updates
- Mozambique: working on final documentation to place order for about 200 patients; still some challenges getting documents in Portuguese; MSF to start 10 patients.
- PNG: placed order for 85 patients but scaled back to 30 in first shipment; proposal for support submitted to USAID; no new patients enrolled in months
- Ukraine: No new updates; trying to access BDQ for 1 patient via CU but no way to import
- Mexico: Does not qualify for donation and cannot get DLM via GDF (see discussion below).
- Haiti: Started enrolling in June, may need another shipment of BDQ.
- Belarus is out of BDQ
- Somalia: just completed GLC visit, plan for BDQ support mission sometime in Q4. Placed an order for DLM.
- Philippines just released BDQ to all 9 “pilot centers”, including those in Metro Manila
- Pakistan: Clinical protocols finalized, hope to start with NTP soon (October); IRD in private sector
- Afghanistan: on hold right now.

## Issues

- DLM uptake very poor
- Middle income countries: what can they do for new drugs
- Pediatric use of delamanid

Figure 1: Progress in BDQ and DLM by Month

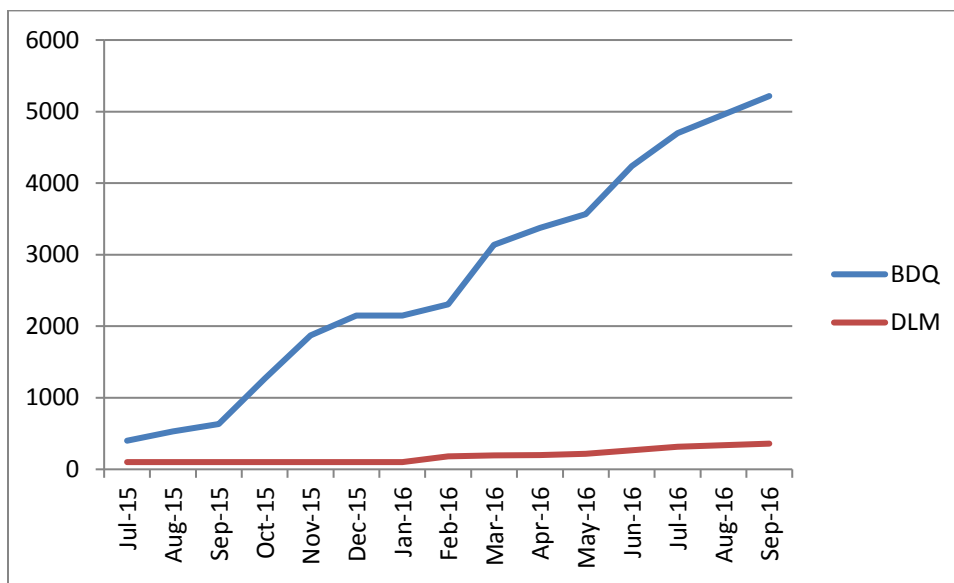


Figure 2: Progress in BDQ and DLM by Month Compared with Estimated Need
